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HOW TO OBTAIN ZIKA VIRUS TESTING FOR PATIENTS AT RISK - EFFECTIVE MARCH 14, 2016

CDPH is now providing Zika virus as well as dengue and chikungunya viruses in the following circumstances:

- <u>Patients with Zika virus symptoms</u> and <u>travel to an area with active Zika transmission</u> within two weeks of symptom onset.
- Patients with Zika virus symptoms and a symptomatic male sexual partner who traveled to an area with active Zika transmission within two weeks of symptom onset.
- Pregnant patients with no symptoms of Zika virus but travel to an area with active Zika transmission 2-12 weeks previously.
- <u>Pregnant patients with no symptoms of Zika virus</u> but <u>a symptomatic male sexual partner</u> who traveled to an area with active Zika transmission within two weeks of symptom onset.
- Other circumstances may merit Zika virus testing.

Two types of Zika tests are offered:

- Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing for Zika RNA is the preferred method for symptomatic patients.
 PCR testing can only be performed within seven (7) days of symptom onset.
 PCR tests are for symptomatic patients only at this time.
- Serologic testing can be done on specimens <u>collected 4 or more days after symptom onset</u>. Serologic testing is the only testing method currently available for asymptomatic pregnant women.
- Because testing has strict time windows, testing needs to be done as soon as possible.

All requests for Zika testing must come from a medical provider and <u>have the approval of the public health</u> department of the patient's county of residence.

If you have a patient at risk for Zika or with Zika symptoms, <u>contact the appropriate public health agency as</u> soon as possible, preferably while still seeing the patient, to obtain approval.
