

I hereby submit to you the 1983 Agricultural Crop Report in compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural production in Sutter County for 1983 was \$205,355,300. This was a reduction of \$42,448,000 from the 1982 gross production value of \$247,784,100.

The 1983 crop year was a repeat of the 1982 crop year with unseasonably heavy rains that continued from October, 1982 through April of 1983, creating havoc with preparation and planting of crops. The July, 1982 through June, 1983 rainfall of 35.43 inches was considerably greater than the normal of 20 inches. As in 1982 a considerable tree loss occurred. Most of the loss was in Cling Peaches where a total of 2,736 acres of bearing trees were lost. Overall, yields were down in all orchard crops except almonds and kiwifruit.


Many of the field crops were also affected by the heavy rainfall, causing a reduction in acreage planted or in yields and in many cases, both. Tomatoes, a major crop in this county, suffered drastically reduced planting acreages.

It should be noted the Federal Payment-in-Kind program (PIK) was extensively implemented by Sutter County farmers, affecting acreage of small grains, especially rice and milo. Rice acreage dropped from 112,684 acres in 1982 to 63,068 acres in 1983 and milo acreage dropped from 24,349 acres in 1982 to 11,320 acres in 1983, mostly as a result of the PIK program. The impact of this reduced production on our agriculturally oriented economy can clearly be seen.

Agriculture continues to be the number one industry in Sutter County despite the hardships it has faced these past two years. The future appears brighter at this time and 1984 should be a more favorable year for the farmers and the related agricultural industries in Sutter County.

We wish to thank all those persons and businesses that took the time to provide the information needed to compile this report.
