Gentlemen:

The 1987 Agricultural Crop Report for Sutter County is hereby submitted to you in compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

The estimated value of Sutter County's agricultural production for the 1987 calendar year was \$216,183,600 which is down 5.75% from the 1986 estimated total of 229,364,800. This is the third year in a row that the value has gone down and that reflects the general condition of Agriculture as a whole in the United States today. There are a number of reasons for the downturn in Agricultural values, the chief one being foreign competition, along with the existence of surpluses in the world market of many of the crops grown in the United States and Sutter County. Many of the third world countries have gone from importing agricultural commodities to exporting them, reducing the market for our agricultural commodities. I feel that Sutter County farmers are in a period of adjustment presently, and we will see this downtrend stop and level out as they adjust their crops to demand.

The one bright spot in Sutter County Agricultural values was in Fruit and Nut crops where the value increased from \$78,743,300 in 1986 to \$93,580,500 in 1987. This is almost a \$15 million dollar increase in value to be attributed totally to increased yields in Almonds, Prunes and English Walnuts. The only major crop where yields were down somewhat was Clingstone Peaches and the total value of the crop remained about the same because of a price increase.

Agriculture is still the number one industry in Sutter County and will continue in that position for a long time. Farmers in Sutter County, as well as the rest of the United States, will be constantly adjusting their cropping patterns to the market, and crops that once were major may no longer be grown here. Sutter County farmers are already looking at replacement crops, as we have seen with Kiwifruit, Apples and Wild Rice. Table Grapes, Wine Grapes, Persimmons, Feijoa, Sunflower, Popcorn and a wide variety of vegetable crops are now being looked at closely. Any one of the above mentioned crops could suddenly become a major contributor to the Sutter County agricultural values.

All the above agricultural values only reflect what the crop is worth at the time of harvest. They in no way reflect farm profit and they were never intended to do so. The figures are strictly gross values intended for informational use by industry.

My thanks to Michael Furuta, Agricultural Biologist III who compiled these figures and to the many farmers, agri-business and related industry people who took the time to provide us with most of the facts and figures used to compile this report.
