SAFE BODY ART ACT

Bloodborne Pathogen (BBP) Exposure Control

Requirements for Trainer Approval

Bloodborne Pathogen (BBP) Exposure Control Training specific to the body art practice must comply with the requirements in H&SC Section 119307. If you are a BBP training provider that would like to be approved and included on the approved trainer listing for the Sutter County's body art practitioners, you must submit the following information:

1. Cover letter indicating name of company/trainer, company address and/or mailing address if different, phone number, email address, and method of training (i.e. web, in-person, etc.).
2. Resume.
3. Training syllabus and/or agenda indicating length of training.
4. Samples of training materials and handouts. Training must address the following:
 - > California Occupational Safety and Health Administration BBP Standard
 - > Transmission, control, and symptoms of the diseases caused by BBP
 - > Tasks involved in performing body art and how those tasks may lead to exposure to BBP for the client or practitioner
 - > Types and uses of all personal protective equipment, including an explanation of the limitations of the equipment
 - > Types of tasks and proper technique, and order of tasks before and after putting on and removing personal protective equipment to avoid contamination
 - > Importance of hand hygiene and demonstrate proper technique
 - > Choice, use, and storage of disinfectants and antiseptics
 - > Information on the signage required for biohazard sharps as well as the importance of properly labeling chemicals and supplies
 - > Information on hepatitis B vaccine, including safety and accessibility
 - > Discussion of what constitutes a BBP exposure incident including:
 - √ Examples of BBP exposure, how the exposure occurred, and what actions to take to prevent or minimize future exposures
 - √ Risk of infection following a BBP incident
 - √ Procedures to be followed after an exposure incident including medical follow-up
 - > Opportunities for interactive questions and answers with the instructor.
5. Describe or provide a sample of Proof of Training that will be provided to the practitioners.
6. A written signed statement under penalty of perjury that the course will meet or exceed the requirements of AB 300 Section 119307 (c).
