In accordance with Section 2272 and 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1996 Agricultural Crop Report. Sutter County's gross agricultural production value totaled \$302,706,400, with Rice, Prunes, Tomatoes, Peaches and Walnuts continuing as the leading agricultural commodities.

In comparison to 1995, Apiary Production, Seed Crops and Livestock & Poultry realized a significant increase in value. However, overall crop production values actually decreased 8 percent due to changes in acreage, yield or value of many other crops. The most significant decline was a result of reduced rice acreage, decreased returns for peaches and prunes, lower tomato yields, and a drop in demand for nursery stock.

It must be emphasized that the dollar amounts shown in this report are averages of gross production values and do not reflect actual net income or loss to producers. For every dollar of value of an agricultural product, three and one-half dollars can be applied, thereby making the 1996 economic impact worth \$1.1 billion.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to staff members' Mike Furuta and Laura Poma, and to the many individuals involved in the agricultural industry, who compiled and contributed the information necessary for this report.




