

Did you know?

The home is the most common place where people are exposed to **secondhand smoke**.



There is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke (SHS).

- » SHS contains over 7,000 chemicals including formaldehyde, arsenic, and hydrogen cyanide.
- **33 41,000 non-smokers die** from SHS exposure each year in the U.S.
- » People who live in multi-unit housing without smoke-free policies, are at greater risk of SHS exposure.
- » Up to 65% of the air in an apartment can come from other units in the building.
- » Smoke travels through ventilation systems, electrical outlets, and even plumbing.









CANNABIS CONCERNS

Reports of cannabis or marijuana secondhand smoke exposure are rising in California.

Cannabis secondhand smoke is harmful just like cigarette smoke. It has many of the same toxic chemicals that can cause cancer and other illnesses.

WHAT ABOUT VAPING?

In recent years, "vaping" has been gaining in popularity—especially among youth and young adults. Vaping devices heat a liquid to produce an aerosol that contains a mixture of dangerous chemicals, including heavy metals.



There is no **LEGAL RIGHT to smoke**but there is a legal right to breathe smoke-free air


Residents **NEED** and **WANT** smoke-free housing!

How are smoke-free policies enforced?

- » Education and signage are used to let people know where they can and cannot use tobacco.
- Warning letters can be given to people who violate the policy but most people follow the rules when they know them.
- » Cases of repeat violations could result in eviction.
