PRIORITY AREA: Healthy Beginnings

OVERARCHING VISION: Reduce the incidence of pediatric asthma attacks in Sutter County children and youth

STAKEHOLDERS:

Sutter County Public Health, Sutter County Superintendent of Schools and various Sutter County school districts, Adventist Health and Rideout (AHRO), Ampla Health, Harmony Health, Peach Tree Health, Sutter North

OBJECTIVES:

Reduce hospital emergency department visits for asthma attacks by 20% within three years.

Reduce visits to the school nurse for asthma attacks by 30% within 2 years.

Finalized Objectives

• **Objective #1:** By January 2026, all three federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) in Sutter County will implement STI partner services and linkages to care at all clinic sites

 Objective #2: By January 2026, implement and deliver an age-based targeted curriculum to at least 50% of Sutter County high schools and institutions of higher education

Strategies and Actions

- **Strategies:** Evidence based or data informed actions, decisions, or efforts that will be carried out to meet the identified objectives
 - The objective is <u>WHAT</u> you are going to do, and the strategy is <u>HOW</u> you will achieve it
- **Actions:** The specific programmatic, policy or other actions that implements or "operationalizes" a strategy


- Things to think about with strategies
