

How to Mark Your Ballot

To Vote for a Candidate or a Measure

JUDICIAL
JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT
Vote for One
<input checked="" type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 1
<input type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 2
<input type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 3
<input type="radio"/>
Write-In

1. Completely fill in the oval to the left of the candidate's name or the words "YES" or "NO".
2. Use a blue or black ballpoint pen.
3. You may vote for as many or as few contests as you wish.

How to Vote for a Qualified Write-in Candidate

<input checked="" type="radio"/> <i>Candidate 4</i>
Write-In

To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, write the name of the qualified write-in candidate for that contest on the blank line provided. Completely fill in the oval to the left of the words "WRITE-IN".

Persons who are not qualified will not be counted or shown in results.

If You Make a Mistake While Marking Your Ballot

<input checked="" type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 1
<input checked="" type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 2 <i>yes!</i>
<input type="radio"/> CANDIDATE 3
<input type="radio"/>
Write-In

1. Cross out or mark an "X" over the wrong oval.
2. Completely fill in the correct oval.
3. Write "Yes" next to your choice.
4. **Do not** sign or initial your choices.

Helpful Tips

- **Do not** sign or initial anywhere on your ballot.
- **Do not** use red ink or pencil.
- **Do not** vote for more candidates than the "VOTE FOR" number indicated in each contest. This will cause an overvote, and no candidates will be counted for that contest only. The rest of the ballot will be counted.
